Every responsible concerned is requested to motivate his/her subordinate, students and departmental staff to actively participate in preserving the cleanliness and greenery of the areas under their jurisdiction.

Accordingly, all Heads of Departments, faculty members, officers, and staff are requested to ensure the following on a regular basis:

1. Conduct periodic inspections of departmental surroundings, gardens, roadsides, and common areas to identify and remove weeds, unwanted shrubs, self-grown plants, and accumulated waste.
2. Ensure that classrooms, laboratories, offices, libraries, seminar halls, corridors, and departmental premises are maintained in a clean, orderly, and hygienic condition at all times.
3. Encourage students to adopt responsible environmental practices and strictly discourage littering within the campus.
4. Promote proper segregation and disposal of biodegradable and non-biodegradable waste using designated waste bins.
5. Minimize the use of single-use plastics and encourage eco-friendly alternatives in all university activities.
6. Support regular plantation drives and ensure proper maintenance, watering, and protection of trees, ornamental plants, medicinal gardens, and lawns.
7. Promptly report garbage accumulation, clogged drains, broken dustbins, damaged sanitation facilities, or any issue affecting campus cleanliness to the concerned maintenance authorities.
8. Ensure that departmental notice boards, storage areas, and surrounding open spaces remain free from obsolete materials, scrap, and unnecessary clutter.

9. Encourage students to treat the University campus as a shared responsibility and actively participate in cleanliness and environmental awareness campaigns.
10. Observe cleanliness not merely as a statutory obligation but as a professional and ethical commitment befitting an institution dedicated to agricultural education, research, and extension.

It creates a pleasant ambience for students, faculty, staff, visitors, researchers, and dignitaries while reinforcing our commitment to sustainable development and environmental responsibility.

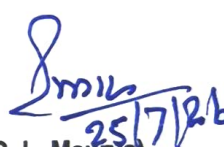
